

What's New: Highlights of Updated FC Reg 200-6

This document only highlights some of the changes that were made this year. Recreationists are still required to know all regulations that are in FC Reg 200-6.

1.) 2-7. Recreationists on Fort Carson and Piñon Canyon Maneuver Site (PCMS)

Will:

c. Cooperate with military officials, Fort Carson Law Enforcement, Range Control, and Directorate of Public Works (DPW) Environmental Personnel.

d. Notify Fort Carson Directorate of Emergency Services (DES) authorities about poaching, uncontrolled fires, the location of unexploded munitions, fuel or other spills, and any observed violations of Fort Carson, state, and federal laws and regulations.

What does this mean for you:

Recreationists will cooperate with military officials and Fort Carson Staff when addressed on any issue or topic. Recreationists will notify Fort Carson Staff of any law enforcement or safety issues.

2.) 3-1g It is strictly prohibited to be checked into a block on iSportsman while not being physically present on Fort Carson or PCMS or past the Range Control building on Fort Carson (Building 9550). The only exception to this is the initial check-in at 4 a.m.

What does this mean for you:

Recreationists cannot remain checked in if they leave the downrange area or never actually recreate. This includes but is not limited to, leaving for the day, leaving for lunch, checking in and never showing up downrange.

This is to address the long-standing issue of blocks being filled on iSportsman without hunters or other recreationists being physically present downrange.

This regulation still allows individuals to check-in at 4 a.m. from any location.

3.) 3-1h If downrange is only open to recreation for a portion of the day, for any reason, check-ins will start at the posted time when downrange is open (i.e. if downrange opens at noon, check-ins will start at noon).

What does this mean for you:

When we have partial day closures due to weather or other circumstances, check-ins will start at the same time downrange opens. For example, if the downrange is closed until 10:00 a.m., check-ins will begin at 10:00 a.m., not at the typical 4:00 a.m. time.

4.) 3-1j It is prohibited to use or solicit use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) for any portion of the iSportsman check-in process.

What does this mean for you:

Individuals cannot use AI to assist with check-ins and they cannot solicit to use AI to check-in.

5.) Removed the regulation that crossbows being prohibited in archery only areas.

What does this mean for you:

Hunters may now use crossbows in archery only areas. Hunters still must follow state laws on crossbows.

6.) 4-1b. Addition of a suspension table for violations.
